Dear Mr. Ryerson,

According to our conversation we shipped to-day to the Art Institute in one case, marked D-R 315 the three pictures which you bought: 1279, Monet, "Sa maison à Argenteuil"- No.1844, Renoir, "Jeune fille assise"- No.3500, Manet, "Jeune femme au chapeau rond"- in another case: D-R 317, we put the Ferdinand Bol, "La Tentation," and the Jongkind, "Vue générale de Honfleur," and in case D-R 316, we put the Monet, No.2077, "La Promenade," and the two Andrés, No.2735, "Le Square de Batignolles" and No.2763, "Intérieur, le soir."

I already gave you the net price on the Jongkind for the Art Institute, \$6000. I would make a net price of \$13,000. for the Ferdinand Bol instead of \$15,000., which we are asking. I gave you a net price of \$5700. for the Monet, "La Promenade" and \$550. for the André, "Square des Batignolles." The other picture by André, No.2963, is \$450.

I am writing to Mr. French advising him of the shipment and the contents of the cases. I do not give him any more details as I presume that you will be in Chicago when the cases are unpacked.
